Happenings at the Herington Public Library:

E-Books: Did you know that you can get eBooks and audio books from Kansas State Library and Sunflower eLibrary for free?

To get eBooks from the Kansas website, go to www.kslib.info. You will also need a Kansas Library card number. If you don't have one already, stop by your local library to get one.

The following information comes from the Kansas website:

eBooks (books read on screen): **3M Cloud Library** - bestsellers, larger publishers; **Enki Library** - great variety, includes self-published; **Freeding** - no holds, large collection; **Total Boox** - no holds, checkouts do not expire, mobile app only; **Britannica E-STAX** - nonfiction for kids, unlimited access; and **TumbleBooks** - storybooks, National Geographic videos, games.

eAudiobooks (books listed also): **OneClickdigital** - has separate registration, offers fiction and popular nonfiction.

Digital storybooks (for young readers): **TumbleBooks** - storybooks, National Geographic videos, games; and **BookFlix** - storybooks with a non-fiction eBook.

You can also find some recommended free sites on this webpage as well. They are: **Project Gutenberg** - eBooks in the public domain. Check here if you want a classic. Read in browser or download to a device; **LibriVox** - audio version of books in the public domain, read by volunteer narrators, listen in browser or download; **Unite for Literacy** - picture eBooks with audio. Audio can be played in several languages.

Visit www.sunflowerelibrary.org to download eBooks and audiobooks. For this website, a Herington Public Library number is needed or a library number from a participating library. Herington Public Library contributes content to the Sunflower eLibrary.
