Happenings at the Herington Public Library:

Coming up: The library will host a "Build a Castle Party" on Thursday, July 13, to wrap up the Summer Reading Program. It will be held in the basement from 6:30 to 8 p.m. Youngsters should bring their reading log for rewards. Summer Boost Campers also will receive rewards.

Youngsters can make princess crowns or knight shields, as well as building castles. There will be stories and snacks. This is a free event.

Plans are also being made for a Lego Building Party on Aug. 12 from 1:30 to 3 p.m. Legos will be provided but must remain at the library.

A special contest is planned to choose the top 10 Legos. Prizes will be awarded to builders. Winning Legos will then be displayed for library patrons to vote on the Lego Champion! There will be a special prize for the winner.

There will be Lego stories and snacks at this event, which is open to all ages. As always, the event is free.

E-Books: Some of you might have notice that OneClick became RBdigital. For more help on this change please visit the Kansas State Library web page at kslib.info. Or you can always stop by the Herington Public Library and we will try to help you figure it out.

Another announcement from the State Library was: "Due to a steep decline in usage over the last year, we have decided not to renew the statewide subscription to Tumblebooks."

The other digital storybook product, BookFlix, continues to be popular and use has increased over the last year. Its subscription has been renewed. Both it and Britannica E-STAX (nonfiction ebooks for youth) will continue to be available for all Kansas residents."

Did You Know: Did you know that the Herington Public Library offered the following:

High Speed Internet - HPL has four patron computers that are available for half-hour sessions if somebody is waiting to use. Those doing work, school work or filling out a job application, may stay on until finished.

Wireless access can also be used after hours outside of the library.

Copy, print and Fax Machine - patrons can make black and white copies or print information off the computers for \$0.15 per page. Color prints are \$0.25 per page. Faxes being sent or received are \$1.00 for the first page, \$0.50 after that. The fax and phone number are the same: 785-258-2011. Please call to let staff know if you will be receiving a fax.

Book Discussion Group - The book group meets on the first Monday of the month at 7:00 PM at the library. Anyone is welcome to come join in even if you read part, all or none of the book.

For July, the group will read "And the Mountains Echoed: A Novel" by Khaled Hosseini. The August book will be "She-Wolves: The Woman who Ruled England before Elizabeth" by Helen Castor.

Newspapers and Magazines - The library receives two daily newspapers that can be read in the library. Several weekly, monthly and bi-monthly magazines can be checked out for two weeks.

Homebound & Outreach Service - Those unable to make it to the library can have items delivered. Staff can also deliver to the curb. Call to let staff know what you want and we will do our best. (Sometime we might not pick the right book, others times we hit the jackpot.)

Handicapped Accessibility - When needing to use the elevator, please ring the door bell on the south door of the library. Staff can unlock the door. Access is available to any level of the library from the elevator.
