2024 Notable Books: The Kansas Notable Books List is the annual recognition of 15 outstanding titles either written by Kansans or about a Kansas related topic. The Kansas Notable Book List highlights a lively contemporary writing community and encourages readers to enjoy some of the best writing of authors among Kansans.

The Herington Public Library received a grant from the State Library to be able to purchase some of the Kansas Notable Books. Once received, books will be displayed on the table in front of the circulation desk. There is a mix of children and adult books on order.

Rotating Books: The library will exchange rotating books on Thursday, Aug. 1. Every two months, new books are available through the North Central Kansas Library System. The collection offers many genres, including mystery, romance, westerns, historical fiction and inspirational. Many are even offered in large type.

Interlibrary Loan: If the library doesn't have a book or movie a patron wants to borrow, give the title to librarian Marilyn Peterson and she will try to borrow it from another library. It normally takes 7 to 10 days for another library to ship it.

Book Group: The book group meets the first Monday of the month at 7 p.m. Anyone wanting to join is welcome. There is no need to purchase the book. Books (sometime large print and on CD) are available to check out. Discussions typically last about an hour.

Programs Available: If any local groups would like an activity planned or program offered, contact the library. Susan Mueller is willing to share a craft activity or informative program with Scout groups, 4-H members, clubs or other groups in the community.
