Fall Story Time: The fun and educational Fall Story Time begins on Thursday, Sept. 11, and continues through Oct. 30. All sessions will meet at 9 a.m. in the library basement. It's free!

Fall Festival: The Herington Public Library will join the fun of Herington's Fall Festival on Saturday, Oct. 25. Children are welcome at the library from 2 until 3:30 p.m. for a come-and-go fall craft and story event in the basement. Varied crafts can be made for free!

2025 Notable Books: The Kansas Notable Books List is the annual recognition of 15 outstanding titles either written by Kansans or about a Kansas related topic. The Kansas Notable Book List highlights a lively contemporary writing community and encourages readers to enjoy some of the best writing of authors among Kansans and about Kansas.

The Herington Public Library received a grant from the State Library to purchase some of the Kansas Notable Books. These books are on displayed on the table in front of the circulation desk. There is a mix of children's and adult books available.

Pilcrow Books: The library received more than 100 books from the Pilcrow Foundation, a group that assists small and rural libraries to build children's and youth collections. Rotating Books: The library exchanges rotating books on Thursday, September 25th.

September is Library Card Sign-Up Month: September is Library Card Sign-Up Month, a time when the American Library Association (ALA) and libraries nationwide join together to remind parents, caregivers and students that signing up for a library card (we don't hand out cards, we go by number or last name) is the first step towards academic achievement and lifelong learning.

To obtain a number, bring a photo ID, proof of current address and complete a brief application. No matter whether attending school or being homeschooled, the library is here to help. If the library doesn't have the materials needed, staff will try to obtain them from another library. For more information, call the library at 785-258-2011. The library staff looks forward to assisting all patrons!

Herington Year Books: The library has yearbooks from 1950—2019 that are available on CDs to be viewed at the library.

CAC Reader: The library has a CAC Reader for patron use.

A CAC reader is a device that enables a user to access and utilize the information stored on a Common Access Card (CAC). The CAC, a smart card issued by the U.S. Department of Defense, is used for identification and access to secure systems and facilities by military personnel, civilian employees, and contractors. CAC readers connect to computers, allowing users to authenticate their identity, access online military services, and perform tasks like accessing encrypted emails, signing documents digitally, and managing travel vouchers.

Book Discussion Group - The book group meets on the first Monday of the month at 7 p.m. at the library. Everyone is welcome.

Copy, print and Fax Machines - Patrons can make black and white copies or print information off the computers for 15 cents per page. Color prints are 25 cents per page. Faxes being sent or received are \$1 for the first page, 50 cents after that. Please call to let staff know if you will be receiving a fax.
