Libraries across North Central Kansas are launching a region-wide Public Library Crawl in celebration of America 250. The summer initiative invites community members to explore local libraries while discovering the unique stories and history that shape each town.

Participants are encouraged to visit each library on the official crawl list. Every stop earns one entry into a regional prize drawing, and completing the full crawl awards an additional ten bonus entries.

At each location, visitors can scan a QR code and answer a library-specific history question or identify a special password to qualify for the drawing.

Winners will be selected on August 5, with multiple prizes awarded.
